Prep Weeks comprise **German Intensive Course**, enrolment procedure and study preparation. Intensive course: Free comprehensive language and orientation course to improve German skills. Listening and reading comprehension, writing and oral expression, German culture, history and politics. Get to know the campus, the city of Erfurt & its surroundings. **Language levels: A1-B1. Upon** successful participation, **6 ECTS** will be obtained.
